

## NOVEMBER CALENDAR

*Please note that not all those who have these beliefs are abusive. Not all those who adhere to a belief system will observe all holidays. Dates with significance to individual groups, like leaders' birthdays, may also be celebrated. Those groups that utilise numerology mark dates whose numbers add up to "power numbers".*

### Nov. 1:

- Oíche Shamhna (/ˈiːhə ˈhaʊnə/ EE-hə HOW-nə) is a Gaelic festival on 1 November marking the end of the harvest season and beginning of winter or "darker half" of the year.
- All Saints Day; Also known as All Hallows Day, is a day to honour all saints from Christian history, understanding that there is a spiritual connection between heaven and earth.
- Day of the Banshees Reign of Celtic Cailleach, Crone Goddess.
- Diwali: Hindu: Festival of Lights: The end of Lord Rama's exile killing of a demon by Krishna's wife (festival usually falls in October or November)
- Fon/Vodou feast of Ghede, Loa of the Dead; time for honouring ancestral spirits. Fon/Vodouisants believe all Loas (Deities) originate from Co-Creators Goddess-God Mawu- Lisa.
- Dio De Los Muertos , a two-day celebration on November 1 and 2

**Oct 31-Nov. 6:** Mid-Autumn / Day of the Dead / Halloween – Festival marking the transformation of life to death, the end of the agricultural year, departure of migrating and hibernating animals, and decay and death of vegetal and animal life. Observed by remembering departed ancestors and contemplating one's own mortality.

**Nov.1-Nov. 6-**The Isia: six day ritual drama search for pieces of Osiris/feast of the Netherworld parting of the astral veil/resurrection of Osiris

### Nov. 2:

- All Souls Day, Christians remember their own dead — relatives, ancestors, beloved dead.
- White Tara Day. Day for meditation on Tantric Bodhisattva Goddess, White Tara, who guides the dead to Buddha Amitabha's Pure Land, where all will find salvation.
- Birth of the Bab
- Festival of Woden (Odin)
- David Lane Birthday - Founding Member of The Order (1938)
- Animas or the Day of Difuntos (Occult)

### Nov. 3:

Christian feast of St. Martin of Porres (d. 1639), healer and advocate of social equality and inter-ethnic harmony; guide of healers and human rights activists.

### Nov. 4:

Satanic Revels (sexual)

### Nov. 5:

- Guy Fawkes' Day (UK)
- Christians remember and honour the dead.
- Devil's Boulder

**Nov. 6:**

- Birth of the Dragon Goddess Tiamat

**Nov. 7:**

- Hilaria/Mania (Open of Mundus Ceteris) rebirth of Osiris.
- Astrological Samhain.
- Night of Hecate
- God Lono is honoured on this day with a Harvest Festival. Another festival, the Makahiki festival also takes place

**Nov. 7-Nov. 9** Feast of Divine Justice – Source of just law, honouring Goddess-God as Maat-Thoth (Egyptian); Goddess as Themis (Greek), Justice (Christian), and God as Forseti (Norse).

**Nov. 8:**

- Seven Holy Archangels Day (Orthodox Christian). The seven original Archangels to the Eastern Orthodox Church are: Michael, Gabriel, Raphael, Uriel, Raguel, Sariel, and the fallen Lucifer. Lucifer lost his place to another Archangel but the various lists can't make their minds up about the name of the new archangel. Baracael, leadiel, Sealtiel, Peliel, and Gamael are some of the possibilities. The Book of Enoch says: The big four plus Raguel, Sariel, and Jerahmeel, while from other apocryphal sources we get the variant names Izidkiel, Hanael, and Kepharel instead of the last three.
- Gospel riots: Bloody clashes take place in Athens following the translation of the Gospels into demotic Greek. (1901)
- Hati, ancestral spirits and household Gods are honoured on this day with offerings of yams to ensure a good harvest in the upcoming year.
- In Japan, the kitchen fire Goddess Hettsui No Kami, who protects and provides for people with harvested food is honoured with a Shinto festival, Fuigo Matsuri.

**Nov. 9:**

- Kristallnacht
- Loy Krathong

**Nov. 10:**

- A Goddess of Reason is proclaimed by the French Convention at the suggestion of Pierre Gaspard Chaumette.
- The Secret Nine
- Scottish festival of Old November Eve was held on this date. The Goddess of the Hunt, Nicnevin, was honoured with prayers and feasts. It was believed that she rode through the air with her entourage, (the wild hunt/ghost riders in the sky) between 9 and 10 at night and sometimes even made herself visible to mortals in other forms.

**Nov. 11:**

- Feast of Dionysus – Greek God whom Yeshua was “connected to” as the Cosmic Gnosis. Also Veteran’s Day when we remember the dead.
- Celtic Lunatishees – Day of the Faerie Sidhe, Old November Day.
- Paracelsus, Swiss-German physician, botanist, astrologer, and occultist is born.
- The annual feast of Vinalia.

**Nov. 12:**

- Mysteries of the Murder of Asar: Kemetic (ancient Egyptian) holy day. Mysteries of the Murder of Asar [Osiris]. Asar [Osiris] murdered by Set.
- Epulum Jovis: Roman holy day. Epulum Jovis. Feast of Jupiter, Juno, and Minerva.

**Nov. 13:**

- Festival of Jupiter – Roman deity associated with rain and agriculture, prime protector of the st
- Thirteenth day after Samhain, was considered a day of darkness, evil, and misfortune in Mediaeval times. On this day the dead and other spirits were believed to be easily summoned to assist in magic.
- Roman Fontinalia – Feast of Fons, God of Springs.

*Some groups believe a child born on Friday the 13th will be unlucky for life. If a child's name has 13 letters, the child will have "devil's luck,"*

**Nov. 14:**

- Druids held the Feast of the Musicians
- India, children receive blessings at the temples from their Goddesses: Befana, Mayael, Rumina, and Surabhi.

**Nov. 15:**

- Birthday of Guru Nanak Dev Sahib

**Nov. 16:**

- Night of Hecate, Greek Goddess of the Hags or Wisewomen,
- Deepvali or Diwali
- Festival of Bastet
- Hed Sed Festival

**11/16 (12/27):** Beginning of Old Egyptian Proyet/Emergence month of Shefbedet/Tobi. Priests and priestesses made offerings to the Neteru (Gods and Goddesses) to ensure that there would be peace and harmony throughout the land.

**Nov. 17**

- The last of three annual festivals of death is observed in parts of China. Paper clothing and money with the names of ancestors in the spirit world written on them are burned as offerings.
- Sama Atar or Daevayasna-Yatuk Dinoh

**Nov. 18:**

- Occult Day celebrates the mystery, the unknown, and the magical connections that bind the cosmos.
- Aleister Crowley is initiated in the Hermetic Order of the Golden Dawn.
- Ardvi, Mother of the Stars, a Persian Goddess is honoured with a festival called Ardvi Sura, held under the night sky and celebrated in Southwestern Asia since ancient times.

**Nov. 19:**

- People believed that the first stranger you met dressed in black on this day was a warlock and avoided looking directly in the eyes of such a person for fear of bewitchment.

**Nov. 20:**

- Day of All Gnostic Saints
- Occultist and author Samuel L. MacGregor Mathers dies.
- Rituals of thanksgiving to the God Lono are held.

**Nov. 21**

- Festival of celebration lasting several days and nights, honouring the God Kukulcan

**Nov. 22:**

- Festival of Diana – Roman Goddess of Moon, Hunt, Wilderness, Birth
- Feast of Weyland – Norse God of the Smiths.
- Nachashiron
- Night of Shiva

**Nov. 23:**

- Fibonacci Day
- Niiname-Sai

**Nov. 24:**

- Martyrdom of Guru Tegh Bahadur Sahib
- Feast of the Burning Lamps, Egyptian festival
- Celtic Tree Month of Reed ends – Tree Month of Elder begins
- Feast of Christ the King.

**Nov. 24-Dec. 23:** Celtic Tree Month of Elder begins

**Nov. 25:**

- Yoruba/Santeria feast of Oya, Orisha of Death and Rebirth.
- The Order signs Declaration of War against the government of the United States (1984)
- Feast of Santa Catalina de la Alejandira

**Nov. 26:**

- Ascension of 'Abdu'l-Bahá
- Vlad the Impaler defeats Basarab Laiota with the help of Stephen the Great and Stephen V Báthory and becomes the ruler of Wallachia for the third time.
- Karl Hand Birthday (Ku Klux Klan & National Socialist Liberation Front)

**Nov. 27:**

- Day of Parvati – Hindu Mother of the Universe
- Feast of Ullr: "The Feast of Ullr was to celebrate the Hunt and to gain the personal luck needed for success. Weapons are dedicated on this day to Ullr. If your arms were blessed by the luck of the God of the Hunt, your family and tribe shared the bounty with a Blot and Feast to Ullr."

4th Thursday of November: Thanksgiving Day-The fertile abundance of mother earth, and basic necessities of life, "thread, bread, and shed." (Clothes, food, shelter).

**Nov. 29**

- Egyptian Feast of Hathor – as Sekmet, Lioness and Sun Goddess, the alternate of Bast, the Cat Goddess.
- Feast of Hathor

**Nov. 30:**

- Birthday of Oberon Zell-Ravenheart, founder of Church of All Worlds
- Festival of Hecate, a goddess of magic and sorcery
- Larry "King Hoover" Hoover Birthday: Founder of the Gangster Disciples and Folk Nation
- Bonifacio Day

Last Sunday of November begins Advent, the Festival of Lights for the Coming of the Light of the World – Christian vigil for the birth of the Cosmic Christ. Advent candles are lit on each of the four Sundays before Christmas. A purple one on the 1st, 2nd and 4th Sundays, and a pink one on the 3rd Sunday.
