The other three forty day periods are: Fall Equinox (Sept 22 or 23) to Halloween/AllSaints Day (Oct. 31, Nov.1), Dec. 25 to Candlemas (Feb 1 or 2) and Lent. Lent is the forty day period beginning on Ash Wednesday and ending on Easter Sunday every year.
